Check Meyers, Ticket Sales Chairman and the entire group responsible for the record sales deserve special recognition for their outstanding contribution to the success of the party.



TICKETS WILL SOON BE DISTRIBUTED AND MOST MEMBERS WILL BE ASSIGNED DEFINITE CONTACTS. HOWEVER, OUR GOAL IS THAT ALL MEMBERS SELL AS MANY TICKETS AS POSSIBLE. ADDITIONAL TICKETS CAN BE OBTAINED FROM CHUCK MEYERS, EXTENSION 6-4168.

THE 1971 E.G.L. GOLF SEASON WILL COMMENCE MAY 10, 1971 AND EXTEND FOR THIRTEEN (13) WEEKS. PLAY WILL BE AT THE SOUTHMOOR COUNTRY CLUB WITH TEE-OFF TIMES RESERVED FOR BOTH NINES BETWEEN 5:00 P.M. AND 5:32 P.M.

THE SCHEDULE IS COMPRISED OF ELEVEN (11) COMPETITIVE NIGHTS WITH AN OPENING AND CLOSING EVENT NIGHT. DETAILS OF THESE SPECIAL EVENTS WILL BE ANNOUNCED LATER IN A SPECIAL PUBLICATION. LEAGUE SCORING WILL BE ON A MATCH-MEDAL POINT SYSTEM. SIX (6) POINTS AWARDED FOR THE LOW TEAM NET AND TWO (2) POINTS FOR THE LOW TEAM NET FOR EACH OF THE NINE HOLES. TEAMS ARE DIVIDED INTO TWO (2) FLIGHTS BASED ON THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE HANDICAP OF A COMPLETE TEAM. SEVERAL MEMBERS HAVE CHOSED TO BE DESIGNATED AS OFFICIAL SUBSTITUTES AND ARE LISTED AT THE BOTTOM OF THE "A" FLIGHT TEAM.

THE COMPETITIVE NIGHTS, ELEVEN (11), ARE DIVIDED INTO TWO (2) SEGMENTS. THE FIRST SIX (6) COMPETITIVE NIGHTS WILL COMPRISE THE FIRST HALF OF THE SEASON. UPON COMPLETION OF THE SIX (6) NIGHTS THE TEAM TOTALS WILL BE ROLLED BACK TO ZERO. THE SECOND HALF WILL CONSIST OF FIVE (5) WEEKS OF SCHEDULED LEAGUE PLAY. THE WINNERS OF EACH SEASON SEGMENT IN EACH FLIGHT WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY FOR THE LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP. IN THE EVENT OF A REPEAT WINNER, THE SECOND PLACE TEAM OF THE FIRST SEGMENT WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP. THE LEAGUE CHAMPION WILL BE DETERMINED ON THE LOW NET TEAM SCORE FOR NINE HOLES. IN ADDITION TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT, A CONSOLATION TOURNAMENT WILL BE PLAYED CONSISTING OF THE LAST PLACE TEAM IN EACH FLIGHT. LAST PLACE ELIGIBLES WILL BE DETERMINED AS THE TEAM WITH THE LOWEST CUMULATIVE POINT SCORE FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON IN EACH FLIGHT.

TEAM CAPTAINS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SIGNING IN OF THE TEAM MEMBERS ON THE ROSTER SHEET LOCATED IN THE CLUB HOUSE. THEY WILL ALSO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR INSURING THAT ALL TOTALS ARE COMPLETE ON THE CARD. FURTHER, THEY WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUBMITTING OF THE CARD AT THE END OF PLAY TO ONE OF THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS, WHO ARE NOTED IN THIS MEMORANDUM.

THE GOLF ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE WOULD BE REMISS IF IT FAILED TO REMIND THE MEMBERSHIP THAT THE IMAGE AND PRESTIGE OF THE LEAGUE SUFFERS WHEN GOOD GOLF ETIQUETTE IS NOT EXERCISED AT ALL TIMES. THIS INCLUDES ADHERENCE TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GOLF COURSE AND THE RULES OF THE LEAGUE PROPER.

WE HAVE PUT TOGETHER WHAT WE FEEL IS AN INTERESTING AND BENEFICIAL PROGRAM. THE COMPLETE SUCCESS OF THE PROGRAM IS DEPENDENT ON FULL PARTICIPATION BY EACH LEAGUE MEMBER.

SUBJECT: MEMBERSHIP IN THE EFFICIENCY GOLF LEAGUE

TO: All E. G. L. Members

Over a year ago a committee was formed to look into ways to modify the constitution of the Efficiency Golf League to prepare for an expansion program in the Work Standards area. This committee chaired by Leon Hill, spent a considerable amount of time looking ahead and came up with some modifications to define membership requirements during an expected expansion period. The league vote, last year, on the new constitution was almost unanimous. (The section on membership is attached).

Last fall a petition was received requesting the Board of Directors to consider a membership vote to change the constitution by freezing the membership as of September 1, 1970 and allowing only vacancies to be filled by new members in the Work Standards area.

This years Board of Directors has studied this petition carefully along with the work of last years group.

The expansion of the Work Standards area now seems to be complete. This expansion, in general, amounts to about 15 men in the area of Work Standards. The "Work Standard Department" is now a portion of the Industrial Engineering Department and as a separate department no longer exists.


After considering all aspects of this expansion as it affects the Efficiency Golf League, the Board of Directors at its January 20, 1971 meeting voted unanimously to deny the petition to restrict membership and to extend membership as outlined in the constitution.

We have appointed Leon Hill as permanent Membership Chairman to insure that the Membership Program is handled in an orderly manner.



EFFICIENCY GOLF LEAGUE

CONSTITUTION - SEPTEMBER, 1970

MEMBERSHIP

1. ELIGIBILITY

- A. Effective August 1, 1970, only male employees assigned to the Work Standard Division; who are engaged in those activities including time study, setting work standards, standard time development and maintenance, and/or any other activity which has historically by definition been a part of the Work Standards job description; shall be eligible for immediate membership. Said membership shall be considered as temporary for a two year period, not necessarily consecutive, during which time said membership shall neither be allowed to vote nor to hold any elected or appointed league office. Failure to complete two year's service in the previously described Work Standards Division for any reason, will void any claim to permanent membership for future years or any other benefit that said membership might provide, except as provided for in Section 2-1-C. It is further stated that, those members of the afore mentioned Work Standard Division on or before August 1, 1970 shall be governed by the rules in effect prior to the stated date shown in this Constitutional Amendment.
